

Aaron's Harry Potter Game Rules

Objective:

Players work together to destroy all Death Eaters and avoid getting killed by Death Eaters that are also on the board. Death Eaters are killed by spells that are collected in the Cards space on the game board.

Set-up:

- 1. Lay out the game board and shuffle the Spell Cards.**
- 2. Place the deck of cards, face down on the designated spot on the game board.**
- 3. All players choose a character token and place them in the starting space on the game board.**

Rules

- 1. Each player rolls one die to determine who goes first. The player with the highest roll goes first and then play goes around in a clockwise direction. If there is a tie, the players that are tied re-roll.**
- 2. On their turn, each player rolls 2 dice and then moves their character the number of spaces that they rolled. They may choose which direction they wish to move their character. Then they roll one dice to determine how many spaces to move a Death Eater.**
- 3. The player chooses which Death Eater to move. Death Eaters must move in a specific direction depending on the number that is rolled. If the number rolled is an even number, the Death Eater can only move right or up. If the number rolled is odd, the Death Eater can only move left or down.**
- 4. On the board, there are spaces labelled "Card". If a player lands on that space after moving the number of spaces that they rolled on the dice, they may pick up a card from the top of the Spell Card pile. They keep the card to use later.**
- 5. There are two types of cards. One is an Attack card and one is a Defense card. The Attack card can be used to defeat a Death Eater and the Defense card can be used to avoid being eliminated from the game by the Death Eater.**
- 6. Players can use the Attack Card to defeat the Death Eaters when they land on the same space or on a space right next to the Death Eater on their roll.**
- 7. A Death Eater can eliminate a player when the Death Eater lands on the same spot as the player after moving the number of spaces rolled on that turn.**
- 8. A player avoids elimination if they have a Defense Card that they can use against the Death Eater.**
- 9. Any number of characters (players or Death Eaters) are allowed to be on the same space at the same time.**
- 10. If a Death Eater lands on a space with more than one player there, it can eliminate all the players at once.**
- 11. If a player lands on a space where they are able to attack more than one Death Eater, they must have one Attack Card for each Death Eater they wish to Attack.**
